

What is the European Day of Languages?

- The European Year of Languages 2001, jointly organised by the Council of Europe and the European Union, was successful in involving millions of people across 45 participating countries. Its activities celebrated linguistic diversity in Europe and promoted language learning.
- Following the success of the Year of Languages, the Council of Europe declared a European Day of Languages to be celebrated on 26th of September each year.

LANGUAGE FACTS

- 1) There are between 6,000 and 7,000 languages in the world. They are spoken by 7 billion people, divided into 189 independent countries.
- 2) Most of the world's languages are spoken in Asia and Africa.
- 3) At least half of the world's population is bilingual or multilingual, meaning they speak two or more languages.
- 4) Many languages have over 50,000 words.
- 5) There are about 225 indigenous languages in Europe roughly 3% of the world's total.
